Code of Conduct



Clair's Parents Meeting Parents ADHD Support (CPMP) was set up to support parents, carers families and to promote both public and professional awareness of ADHD.

CPMP is intended to be a safe place to share the ups and downs of caring for a family member who has ADHD. The charity is run by volunteers who all care for a child or young person with ADHD and or may have ADHD themselves. CPMP is a parent/carer only support group.

This code of conduct applies to all members and outlines basic standards of conduct & behaviour to protect both the group and its members. We ask that those who join CPMP to adhere to the code of conduct as set out below.

Standards of conduct & Personal Behaviour

- Members should conduct themselves in a way that will not bring the CPMP into disrepute.
- Members should respect and support the management committee and volunteers who run the group or activities.
- Members should respect the dignity, rights and views of other members.
- Members should always act with integrity when representing CPMP in public, or as a volunteer.
- We politely ask that members respect the right to privacy and confidentiality of others. Everything discussed and posted is confidential and as such no information should be shared from within the group.
- Members should not harass or discriminate against any other member on the basis of age, gender, sexual orientation, colour, race, religion, physical deformity or disability.
- Any adult or child protection issues should be reported to a member of the management committee.
- Any other issues should be reported to one of the management committee or a volunteer representing the CPMP.
- Whilst CPMP does not extensively use social media as a method of support, we wish to make it clear that the group has a legitimate interest in the private activities of group members where they bring the charity into disrepute. We will regard negative or derogatory comments about the charity, in relation to its current funders, potential funders or its patrons as a breach of this agreement and as a result the user(s) will no longer be allowed to access the charity and its services.

Whilst risk assessments are conducted by either CPMP or the venue hired, the general care and safety of children relies on the care and supervision by their parent or carer.
